Victorian Law Reform Commissioner (V.L.R.C.) :

The V.L.R.C.'s working paper on rape produced several suggestions which are now under study in preparation for the report.

Victorian Statute Law Revision Committee (V.S.L.R.C.):

According to a report in "The Age" the retiring Attorney-General, Mr. Wilcox, Q.C. stated that the V.S.L.R.C. would be asked to consider the development of a tort of invasion of privacy and the protection of rights of citizens against the actions of government (Age, 16 March 1976).

Current matters before the Committee are :-

- * Vagrancy (Amendment) Bill 1974.
- * Legal Infancy : including not only contracts and property but the whole question of full legal capacity.
- * Criminal Law: Use of Motor Cars: Forfeiture of motor car in certain offences.
- * Protection of Animals Act 1966 (Rodeos, destruction of unwanted animals, vivisection, whips in horse racing, traps and cages and compounds for birds and animals).
- * Imperial Acts Application Act 1922 : Following the report of Mrs. Kewley.
- * The Constitution Act 1975 : To consider suggestions made by M.P.s during a debate on the Act in 1975.

Western Australian Law Reform Commission (W.A.L.R.C.):

Following are the active projects in the W.A.L.R.C. :-

- * Compensation for Persons detained in custody and subsequently acquitted.

 First draft of the W.P. is under active study. Due for release July 1976.
- * Compensation for new street alignment : Informal report to the Minister.
- * Documents: Official Attestation of: W.P. due in approx. six months.
- * Judgment debts. This will not be treated by way of working paper. Informal advice will be given to the government.
- * Justices Act Review. Report due late 1976.
- * Strata Titles: W.P. due late 1976.
- * Trusts :W.P. on insolvent deceased estates due July 1976. Project being divided into parts.
- * Unclaimed Money: W.P. presently before W.A.L.R.C. To be issued shortly.
- * Administration Bonds and Sureties. Report recently submitted and will be presented to Parliament April 1976.
- * Privilege for Journalists in Court Proceedings: W.P. due June 1976.
- * Suitors Fund Act :Report on Part A (Civil Procedure) already submitted.

- * Court Structure: Project on Justices Act and Local Courts Act being studied in tandem with new project to consider a Small Debts Court in W.A.

Personalia

The Hon. D.S. Thomson, M.C., E.D., M.P.:

The new Minister of Justice and Secretary of the Law Reform Council in New Zealand is the Hon. David Spence Thomson. Before the recent elections, the posts of Attorney-General and Minister of Justice were combined. The positions have now been split again and Mr. Thomson takes over ministerial responsibility for law reform. First elected to the Parliament in 1963, he became Minister of Defence in 1966 and thereafter held a number of portfolios. Following the recent election, Mr. Thomson became Chairman of the Cabinet Committee on legislation. He is a dairy farmer and is married with one son and daughter. During War service he was awarded the Military Cross with Efficiency Decoration and Bar. He retired from military service in 1959 with the rank of Brigadier.

The Hon. Mr. Justice E.P. Hartt:

The Chairman of the Law Reform Commission of Canada, the Hon. Mr. Justice E.Patrick Hartt, completes his five year commission at the end of March 1976. He will be returning to judicial duties as a member of the Supreme Court of Ontario. Aged 49, Hartt J. specialised in criminal law in Toronto before being appointed to the Supreme Court. He was a member of that Court for a little more than four years when called to be the first Chairman of the national Canadian Commission. Canadian Justice Minister Turner described him as "the finest, most progressive of the younger judges with all the human qualities needed to make a profound examination of our federal laws".
