In his Hamlyn Lectures in mid-May 1983, the English Lord Chancellor, Lord Hailsham, endorsed a statement by ex-President Jimmy Carter that 'the single purpose pressure group' had become 'the greatest enemy of individual liberty'. Lord Hailsham did not suggest that such groups should be made illegal. Nor did he suggest that it was possible to differentiate between pressure groups with 'desirable' and 'undesirable' objectives. However, he suggested that there was a danger in pressure groups, founded on perfectly legitimate efforts to achieve a particular or social or political objective, tending to lose their sense of proportion. Lord Hailsham's warning was that a liberal democracy can 'if it is careless' be destroyed from within. Only by self-discipline and mutual tolerance will the

Australian Law Reform Commission (ALRC)

- Law Reform Digest. The Digest will be 'launched' by the Federal Attorney-General, Senator Evans, at the Eighth Australian Law Reform Agencies Conference in Brisbane in July 1983. For distribution thereafter.
- Sentencing. Work in suspension. Hoped to be revived at the end of 1983.
- Privacy Work in hand. (WIH). Draft report with printer. Expected to be tabled in Federal Parliament Budget Sittings in 1983. Project led by Assoc Professor Robert Hayes.
- Evidence. WIH. Further research papers due on exclusion of evidence and privilege. Mr T H Smith, Commissioner in charge, reviewing numerous submissions and previous research papers. ALRC aiming for interim report late 1983.
- Aboriginal Customary Law. WIH. Further series of regional meetings completed together with field trips. See above p.109.
- Standing and Class Actions. WIH. Draft report on standing still being reviewed. Expected publication late 1983. Mr B M Debelle QC is working on draft report on class actions.
- Debt Recovery. Project revised under Professor D St L Kelly. Computer analysis of debt processing in NSW being considered. New research paper series commenced. Project to be concluded early 1984. It will be activated end of 1983.

- Admiralty Jurisdiction and Law. Consultation with professional organisations. Research work commencing under Professor James Crawford, with assistance from Dr D Cremean.
- Foreign State Immunity. Research paper series proceeding. Professor Crawford to have discussions in North America and Britain. Discussion paper expected late 1983.
- Service and Execution of Process. New reference.
 Project commencing under Dr Michael Pryles, new Commissioner. See below p.136.

- Matrimonial Property Law. New reference. To be reviewed in next issue of Reform.

New South Wales Law Reform Commission (NSWLRC)

- Criminal Procedure. Submissions in response to Issues Paper No. 1 are being received and dealt with. The program is being re-considered and it is expected that at least one more publication will be released in 1983.
