

## INVITATION TO PUBLIC HEARINGS ON CONTEMPT LAW

The Australian Law Reform Commission is reviewing the law relating to contempt in relation to courts, commissions and tribunals.

The Commission has published 3 Discussion Papers which explain the present law and suggest changes. Copies may be obtained free of charge from the Commission. The papers are: Contempt and Family Law (DP 24), Contempt and the Media (DP 26) and Contempt: Disruption, Disobedience and Deliberate Interference (DP 27).

The Commission invites comments from interested citizens and organisations so that it can take account of all opinions in preparing its report, which will be tabled in Federal Parliament. It is holding informal public hearings. You are invited to attend and express your views, orally or in writing.
