# National Conference — Wollongong NSW September 2nd to September 6th 1991

Theme: CRIME PREVENTION

# COMMUNITY FEAR or COMMUNITY SAFETY

Committee of Wollongong citizens, supported by Ald. Frank Arkell, MP, Lord Mayor of Wollongong, working in collaboration with the NSW Branch of the Council, is organising the 15th National Conference of the Australian Crime Prevention Council. Those attending will examine crime prevention issues of local, national and international interest. It is hoped that the Conference will meet local concerns about crime and offer some solutions about how to reduce the impact of crime as it affects a progressive industrial city and its hinterland. Some of the wider issues of crime and violence that threaten Australian society will also be considered. The Conference will discuss the ability of our urban community to reduce the present levels of crime in a number of crucial areas and, in particular, the way in which a community can appropriately and proactively work with traditional criminal justice agencies in upholding the law and in the prevention of both violent and non-violent crime.

The Conference, therefore, will deal with the following aspects:
