Administrative Review Council

On 1 May 1989 the Attorney-General announced the appointment of Mr Stephen Charles QC as a member of the Council for a 3-year term from 27 April 1989. Mr Charles is a senior Victorian barrister and has been a Queen's Counsel since 1975. He was Chairman of the Victorian Bar Council from 1983-85 and President of the Australian Bar Association from 1985-86.

Mr Fulton Muir, Chairman of the Canberra Development Board, who has been a member of the Council since 2 April 1986, was re-appointed for a further 3-year term.

Mr G.A. (Bert) Mowbray, who had been acting Director of Research since 3 April 1989 (Admin Review 20:56), was formally appointed to the position on 25 May 1989.

Administrative Appeals Tribunal

In June 1989 the Attorney-General announced that Mr Brian McMahon, Senior Member in Sydney since 1984, had been reappointed to the Tribunal as a Deputy President.
