Appointments

Ms Clare Petre has been appointed to the Council. She is currently employed on a part time basis in a number of capacities: as Chairperson of the Children's Program Committee of the Australian Broadcasting Tribunal, as a lay member of the NSW Medical Tribunal, as co-ordinator of the Intellectual Disability Rights Service and as a member of the review team appointed by the NSW Minister of Health to review the NSW Prison Medical Service and the medical service in juvenile institutions. Ms Petre was appointed because of her extensive knowledge of public administration.



Ms Helen Vorrath, a computer and business management consultant, who became a member of the Council on 25 September 1987, has been reappointed for a term of three years. As noted in the previous Admin Review, Justice D F O'Connor was appointed as President of the Administrative Appeals Tribunal and as a Judge of the Federal Court of Australia from 25 June 1990.
