They're here. The first part of the Northern Territory Law Reports was on display at the official launch of the NTLRs last month. The Administrator, James Muirhead, officially launched the reports, recalling the days of only two judges in the Territory and a longing for authorised reports. Then, he said, there were three judges, and they longed for reports. His Honour said he had spoken with former Chief Justice,

Sir William Forster, who was delighted to hear that the NT now had its own report series. His Honour also paid tribute to the Law Book Company who "looked after the little people," a reference to the lack of massive profits involved in publishing the NTLRs.
