Women & the law: attitudes & bias

The Australian Women's Research Centre, part of Deakin University, is hosting a conference shortly called *Women and the Law: Judicial Attitudes as they Impact on Women*.

The conference will be held at The Windsor in Melbourne on 9-10 June.

It aims to (a) identify areas of the law where awareness is needed with respect to sex-bias and the rights and changing social roles of women; (b) identify processes within the law that hinder equity; and (c) define strategies for dealing with these problems which will form representations to relevant legal and government bodies concerning programmes for community and judicial awareness on these issues.

The conference will bring together members of the judiciary, magistrates, legal practitioners academics and community groups who reflect upon the

processes and content of the law.

The international keynote speaker, Professor Kathleen Mahoney, has worked with the United Nations on these issues and her expertise in highlighting problems within the Canadian system and developing strategies for addressing these problems is internationally recognised.

Other speakers include Justice Elizabeth Evatt AO, Professor Marcia Neave from Monash University, Justice Deidre O'Connor, Pat O'Shane, Justice Alistair Nicholson, Dr Jocelyne Scutt and Justice Jane Matthews.
