Elected as the Member for Wagaman in 1983, he is a former Minister for Transport & Works, Racing and Gaming and Public Employment.


He is also the current Member for Leanyer and the patron of several Territory community organisations.

Mr Finch said he was proud to have been appointed as the new Attorney-General and looked forward to the challenges and rewards it presented.


"Despite the diversity and complexity of this portfolio, it is still fundamentally a 'people' job," Mr Finch said.

\$2.1m for Legal Aid Commissions

Legal Aid Commissions will receive additional funding of \$2.1 million over the 1994-95 financial year.

The announcement was made by Attorney-General Michael Lavarch and Justice Minister Duncan Kerr.

"This funding is additional to that set out in the Commonwealth/State agreements and is provided to Legal Aid Commissions if matched by state and territory governments. This puts on a permanent basis, supplementary funding arrangements used over the last three years," Mr Kerr said.
