Seppelt's Show Sparkling Burgundies have been made at Seppelt's Great Western Winery in Victoria for almost a century. Within Australia, Seppelt's Show Sparkling Shiraz is the only one made in the same way as it was almost 100 years ago. It is the aging process that contributes significantly to the unique and special qualities of the wine, resulting in superb fruit, oak and yeast integration with great maturation characters. These wines are made in small batches and will always be rare.

The Seppelt's Show Sparkling Shiraz, 1985 vintage, is dark garnet red in colour. The nose is very rich and complex. Full flavoured and the distinctive peppery shiraz characters are a feature.

From an outstanding vintage, this is a wine to enjoy and it especially complements the Christmas turkey or plum pudding. Awarded seven trophies, one championship, twenty-three gold, three silver and three bronze medals. A rare wine.

Bollinger R D 1982 – open, fleshy, complex nose, rich demanding palate.

Moet & Chandon Brut 1990 – quite complex and french nose. Rich and mouthfilling;

Deutz Marlborough Cuvee (NZ) – excellent weight and length. Rated the best from New Zealand;

Nautilus Cuvee Marlborough (NZ) – good fruit selection and good acid balance;

Seppelt Sallinger – a great food wine, the can be enjoyed with salmon, seafood and poultry dishes; **Croser** – high quality, easy to drink and easy to enjoy. Fresh and complex.
