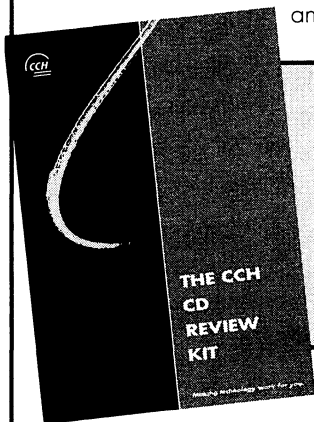

New Appointment for Law Institute of Victoria

The Council of the Law Institute of Victoria have appointed Mr Ian Dunn as the new Executive Director.

Mr Dunn commenced in his recent position as Executive Director on January 15 1996.

Mr Dunn is well qualified for the job. He is a respected litigator, and has been a partner at a major law firm, Wisewoulds, for many years.

He served on the Council of the Law Institute for 12 years and as President in 1987/88.

During his term on the Council, Mr Dunn was closely involved in all aspects of the life of the profession.

He was the founding Chairman of the Specialisation Board (a position he held for six years), chaired the Solicitors' Liability Committee between 1989 and 1992, chaired the Ethics Committee for 5 years and represented Victorian solicitors at the Law Council of Australia (1988-90).

The establishment of the Legal Aid Commission of Victoria, new regimes for compensating injured workers and motor accident victims, the abolition of ad valorem fee scales are among the issues with which Mr Dunn had to deal with during the past decade and half.

He is therefore no stranger to controversy.

He has demonstrated a total commitment to the profession, and a real understanding of the needs of all members.

In recognition of this, he was appointed a Life Member earlier this year.

Mr Dunn is looking forward to working with his counterparts around the country on issues of mutual concern.
