The meeting boasted an impressive turnout of some 50 members and voting exceeded previous records, with approximately 200 votes being cast for the Executive and Council.



Other business of the meeting included a vote to amend the Society's Constitution so that it allowed an alternate Alice Springs representative to attend Council meetings in the stead of the Alice Springs member.

Members' attention was drawn to the proposed changes in Supreme Court Rules - Order 48 and copies of the draft rules were available at the meeting.

In addition, the matter of a change in 'right to silence' legislation was raised and the new President advised practitioners to inform themselves on the issues surrounding this contentious matter.

Following the meeting members adjourned to the poolside bar area to continue informal discussions and enjoy refreshments as the Darwin sun set on a good evening's business.
