

The Barossa Valley is recognised as one of the most consistent producers of quality wines across the red wine spectrum of any wine-producing area in Australia. Shiraz, cabernet sauvignon, merlot, malbec and grenache all thrive in the region. Year in, year out great wines result.

1996 Grant Burge Filsell Shiraz

The Filsell Vineyard in Lyndoch is Grant Burge's oldest vineyard and is the vineyard form which his famous Meshach is produced and the home of Filsell Shiraz, a medal winning red wine. The 1996 Filsell Shiraz is a wine which will offer excellent young drinking and will continue to develop.

1996 Cameron Vale Cabernet Sauvignon

The bouquet is typically cabernet

sauvignon, highlighted by mint and green leaf varietal characteristics. The palate is full of flavour and complemented by the French oak maturation. The 1996 Cameron Vale Cabernet Sauvignon is a wine which will continue to develop and offer classic drinking a decade from now.

1996 Hillcot Merlot

This is one of the most underrated wine styles in the Barossa Valley. Too often used as a blending wine, merlot can stand on its own as a wine of great quality and style. Well balanced and exhibiting a soft tannin finish, this is a wine which rewards from the time of release but will continue to develop.

1994 Meshach

Grant Burge rates the 1994 as one of his best, a magnificent full-bodied red wine displaying wonderful fruit characteristics and underpinned by a marvellous oak treatment. Big and robust the 1994 Meshach is a wine which will live for 15 - 20 years. Limited stocks available.

1995 Henschke Mount Edelstone

100% old vine shiraz grown in the Eden Valley region. The 70 year old dry grown vines are low yielding, producing intensity of colour, deep fruit flavours. The palate has a slightly firmer tannin finish reflecting the drought and low yields of 1995.

1995 Lenswood Abbott's Prayer

A blend of merlot, cabernet sauvignon, and cabernet franc grapes grown in the Adelaide Hills. Crimson ruby in colour with a sweet fragrant herbal bouquet. A very good vintage, optimum year 2003.

1995 Keyneton Estate

A blend of 71% shiraz with merlot and cabernet franc grapes grown in the Eden Valley region. A more austere wine than the 1994, again reflecting the drought and low yields of 1995.

1994 Cyril Henschke Cabernet Sauvignon

77% cabernet sauvignon with merlot and cabernet franc grapes grown in the Eden Valley region. Spicy, soft rich complex palate showing good fruit and great length. Exceptional vintage, optimum year 2004.

1993 Henschke Hill of Grace

Due to the minuscule volume of the 1993 Hill of Grace, Henschke have made a decision to release the wine only through cellar door to personal customers only. The volume was significantly reduced because of severe hail damage.

Deputy Director of the ODPP


Wojciech Jacek Karczewski (known in the Territory as Jack) has been appointed Deputy Director of the Office of Public Prosecutions as from 26 June 1998.

Jack has been in the Territory for 14 years commencing as a prosecutor here on his arrival in June 1984. Since that time he has been involved in criminal cases at all levels and has earned a reputation as a fine trial lawyer. Those who work with him in ODPP know him as an approachable and knowledgable adviser on the criminal law and its practice.

Jack was originally admitted to practice in Queensland in December 1974

before serving as a prosecutor in Papua New Guinea between April 1975 and June 1983. He was a senior prosecutor with the ODPP before spending 4 years with the policy division of the Attorney-General's Department where he honed his PR and political skills. He announced, however, that he was much pleased to be returning to the hurly burly of crime as from November 1997. He was then appointed Assistant Director (Darwin) from which position he is now promoted to Deputy Director.
