## Jane Mahoney Collection

A section of the Supreme Court Library has been dedicated to the memory of Jane Mahoney, a former Darwin lawyer.

Jane and her husband, Tony, died tragically on 12 July 1998 when they were struck by a vehicle while they stopped on the Cox Peninsula Road to change a tyre on their vehicle.

Jane was a well respected lawyer and a good friend to many. She is sadly missed. On 26 November, 1999, in celebration of Jane's life, the Northern Territory Women Lawyers Association, with the support and assistance of Jane's family, the Supreme Court Library Committee and the Law Society, opened a special collection in the Supreme Court Library. Melanie Little, President of the NTWLA, welcomed the Chief Justice, the Chief Magistrate and members of the judiciary and legal profession to the dedication ceremony. The dedication, written by Donna Dreier, was read by Sally Gearin, after which, friends and colleagues shared their memories of Jane.
