

## Friday judged 'ridiculous'


A judge in Italy's Court of Cassation has forced a couple to rename their child after concluding that the baby's given name, 'Venerdi' - Italian for Friday - was "ridiculous".

The *Roman Forum* reported that the name would make the child, "susceptible to irony and scorn,


and able to cause great distress to its owner".

## Darwin lawyer celebrates her 30th year in Australia






## Law Society website to be upgraded in early 2008
