In this issue of the Monash University Law Review we proudly pay tribute to Professor Enid Campbell, who held the Sir Isaac Isaacs Chair of Law at Monash University from 1967 to the end of 1997. Professor Campbell has devoted her life to attaining the highest standards of scholarly research and writing in law. It is a happy development that following this year she will continue her work at Monash University. Although her achievements have often received public recognition, we believe it is appropriate at this point in her career that we pay tribute to her through this issue of the Law Review. The articles published, although not commissioned, all relate to one of Professor Campbell's main areas of expertise — Constitutional Law, at state, federal and international levels. This follows. We have thought it appropriate as well to take this opportunity to publish Professor Campbell's bibliography.
