I am very pleased to launch this afternoon this important further contribution to legal scholarship in a wide-ranging and practically significant field, and I congratulate the authors, the Honourable Des Derrington and Mr Ron Ashton.

Our former judicial colleague has been academically very active in his particular variety of “retirement”.

Legal practitioners, courts, academics and citizens who need to deal with insurers, and indeed insurers themselves, are indebted to Des Derrington and Ron Ashton for this third edition of what is a seminal work.

While thankfully the work is not, in the technical sense, an “authority”, we may certainly say it is “authoritative”, and that is the result of the authors’ wide experience and expertise in the field, recognised both nationally and internationally.

I had the opportunity this morning to dip into the book. It is, if I may say, quite amazingly comprehensive. The material and analysis are presented in an extremely useful way. The authors display an acute appreciation of a wide, difficult field of law, and related fields, contract law especially. Their reference to authority is wide-ranging, extending to the USA. The effort which has gone into the publication is nothing short of daunting.

Natural disasters of recent years, including floods in Queensland, have exposed a range of complex insurance issues, and the pendency and resolution of those issues have had a
