25:00 CHALLENGING YEARS \$300 \$450 This film seeks to arouse awareness of the desirability of planning ahead for retirement. It gives pre-retirement advice to a wide spectrum of people: from the factory worker to the executive. Advice is offered to married couples as well as single people. The needs of migrants are also considered. It's approach is positive and encouraging.

COMMUNICATION AND COMPLIANCE 28:00 \$296 \$504 This film looks at four groups of patients with whom there are often communication problems - children the chronically handicapped, psychiatric patients and the elderly. It explores the relationship between communication problems and patient noncompliance. Produced by Sydney University in 1979.

NEW LIFE NEW WAYS 16:00 \$188 \$288 The film focuses on the special problems migrant women face in adapting to Australian society. Problems of isolation, child care, lack of English are features along with difficulties of coping with a society very different from the rural communities from which many migrants come. The film looks at examples of successful community activities which cater for the needs of these women – a "village" atmosphere established at Redfern Baby Health

Centre and a project operating at Cringilla in Wollongong where women gather to learn English while undertaking craft activities. Produced by the New South Wales Film Corporation in 1979

HEALTH HAZARD 26:00 \$297 \$504 This film outlines the extent of patient noncompliance in various therapeutic settings and common misconceptions about noncompliance held by health professionals.

CHART BEFORE THE COURSE

In this film we follow the map-making process from the first aerial photographs through photogrammetric drawings to the final print stage. Among the points discussed are contour lines, grid references and magnetic variations.

GOING BUSH

If a bushwalking adventure is not to turn into some sort of nightmare then careful planning must be undertaken at the outset. Five bushwalkers plan all aspects of their four-day walk before setting off into the wilderness.

GROUND RULES

This is the introductory segment that sets out to establish a broad understanding of the use and need for and of, maps and map-reading skills. Three situations are illustrated: an ambulance attending an accident; a car rally navigator planning his route; and two tourists who are hopelessly lost on a back road

LIE OF THE LAND

Using the example of a company setting up a VHF radio network in rugged mountainous country this segment examines line of sight, gradients and contour patterns.

POINTS OF SURVIVAL

Correct use of a compass in conjunction with intelligent map-reading illustrate how a bushwalker, who has fallen down a cliff is rescued by his wife and ranger who are able to locate him with the aid of map and compass

The Mountain Ash provides food and shelter at ail levels. From the forest floor where the lyre bird scavenges to the tree-tops which provide launch pads for the spectacular sugar gliders.
