# 'LIBRARY EDUCATION UNDER SEIGE'

APPROXIMATELY 50 library educators and those interested in library education met at Fisher Library on 6 and 7 June for a seminar entitled 'Library education under seige'.

The seminar was organised by the Education for Librarianship Section of the LAA, and, using a military theme, examined some of the pressures affecting library education, market expectations, and possible responses from library educators to these pressures and expectations.

Many ideas provided food for thought and were presented by speakers who included John Phelan from the New South Wales Higher Education Board who addressed the heavy weapons: governmental policy and planning issues.

The big guns, the LAA's Board of Education were represented by the Chairman, Ted Flowers, and past chairman, Dr Neil Radford. The attacks by the practitioners were given by Mary Bays of CLANN, Carol Small of Manly Public Library, and Stephen Wall of Horan, Wall and Walker.

The second day began with the counter offensive from the library schools, represented by Jean Whyte of Monash, Dr Nancy Lane of WAIT, and John Levett from TCAE. Reinforcement was given by Jean Gledhill of KCAE's Department of Communication Studies who presented some teaching strategies for new situations.

The seminar provided an excellent opportunity for library educators to discuss their common problems, and will hopefully lead to solutions to those problems. The proceedings of the seminar will be published.
