

LAA/NLA HEADS MEET

THE ASSOCIATION'S President, Mr Denis Richardson, and the Executive Director, Mr Gordon Bower met with the new Director-General of the National Library of Australia, Mr Harrison Bryan, on 17 September 1980 for an extended discussion on matters of common interest.

One of the major purposes of the meeting was to discuss ways in which the Association and the Library could co-operate in informing members of the profession about forthcoming developments in the national sphere. Among the items discussed were NLA membership of committees being formed jointly by the LAA, AACOBs and the National Library on the domestic satellite system and an Australian committee on cataloguing, and the use of National Library consultants and visitors for LAA continuing education activities. Recent developments in copyright and Freedom of Information legislation were also discussed.

The Association welcomes this opportunity to discuss important issues with the Director-General. The meeting was held by all parties to be useful, and it is intended that meetings will take place perhaps once or twice a year in future. *G. Bower*, Executive Director

A NATIONAL SEMINAR on External Studies in Library Science was held at Riverina CAE from 15-18 July with over 50 representatives from each state and from the NT. The seminar was organised and co-ordinated by Syd Davis of the Riverina CAE's Department of Library and Information Science. It was sponsored by the Australian and South Pacific External Studies Association, the Library Association of Australia and the Committee of Australian Library Schools.

Library Week — New State Library for NSW

AT THE OFFICIAL opening of Australian Library Week held in the State Library of NSW on 19 September, the Premier's wife, Mrs Jill Wran, announced that NSW is to get a second State Library. The five-storey building will be in Macquarie Street between the Mitchell Library and the north wing of the new Parliament House. It is expected to be completed in time for the bicentenary celebrations in 1988.

Patrick White, the Nobel prize-winning Australian author, in his address at the opening of the week, confessed that he has always been intimidated by libraries. 'The Mitchell frightens me stiff' he said. 'Librarians should make themselves less frightening. You (librarians) are in the best position to give a lead to confused youth ... and don't be too strait-laced', he said.

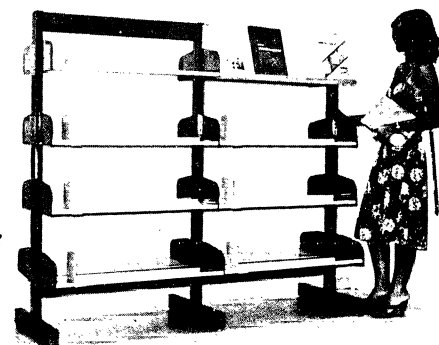
