JOHN FLINT (Chief Librarian, Willoughby Municipal Library, NSW) and his wife NORA HINCEN (Chief Librarian, Stanton Library, NSW) have been awarded jointly the 1980 Albert Mainerd Scholarship. This is the first time in the history of the scholarship that the award has been shared. Venue: Department of Librarianship, RMIT, 200 La Trobe Street, Melbourne.

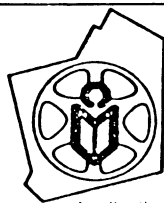
