AUSTRALIAN LIBRARY WEEK will be held from 18 to 26 September this year. The national opening will take place at the Wentworth Hotel, Melbourne. His Excellency, Sir John Mason, the British High Commissioner, will perform the opening ceremony at 6pm on Friday, 18 September.

The Week, organised by the Australian Library Promotion Council in conjunction with State Library Promotion Committees, will have as its slogan *Get booked at your library*.

The entertaining drawings of Ken Maynard will be featured on a wide range of promotional material, including the Library Week banner, plastic bags and T-shirts. Another attraction will be a poster of the inimitable Miss Piggy who will be exhorting her millions of admirers to 'Read'.

In keeping with the IYDP, the Library Week campaign this year will focus on library services and the disabled.

A Report to the Nation on the topic is currently being prepared by Dr Brian Kidd (Chairman, Victorian ACROD Committee on Access and Mobility) and Ross Swindley (Principal Librarian, Social Sciences, NLA).

As well, a booklist on disabled children in children's literature is being compiled by Valerie Weldrick (Public Libraries Division, State Library of NSW).

APPLICATIONS are now invited for this year's ANZAC Fellowship Scheme.

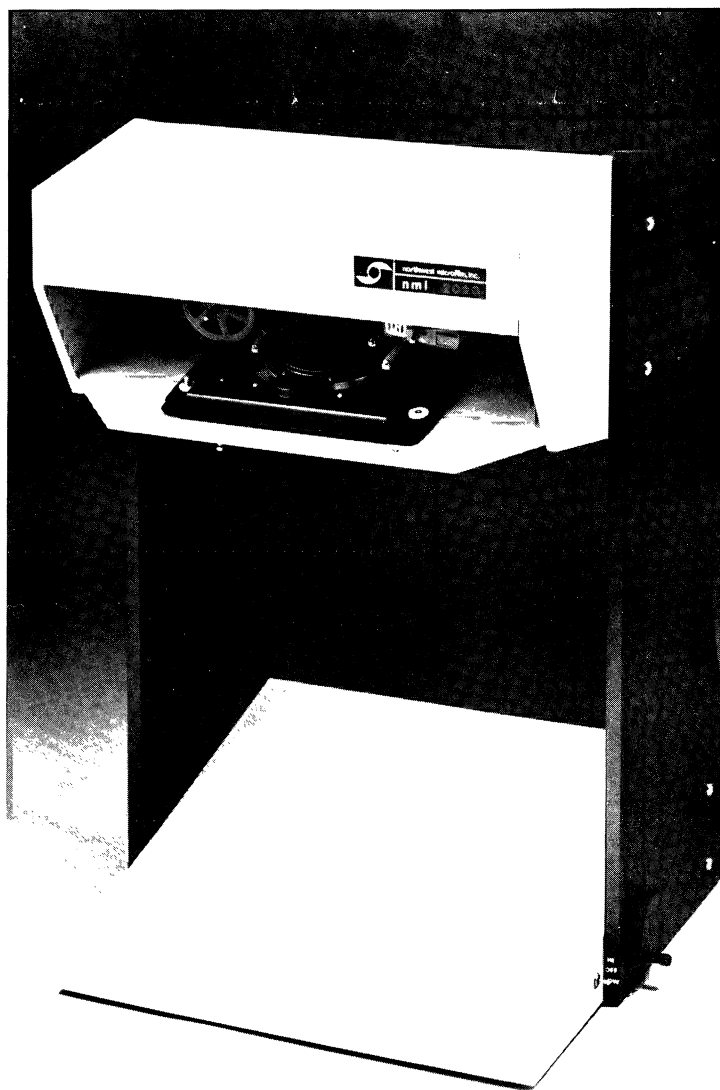
