Mr Holgate said that while the major libraries had co-operated in the past in attempting to avoid unnecessary duplication, it was even more necessary now in times of financial stringency.

China tour

A S ANNOUNCED in a previous issue of *Incite*, a study tour of libraries and related information agencies in the People's Republic of China is being planned as a joint venture between the LAA and the China Society of Library Science.

The details which follow are not final. Any member interested in joining the tour should forward their name and address to the address below so that further information can be sent as it comes to hand.

It is anticipated that the tour will visit China for three to four weeks during June 1982.

The cost is expected to be around \$2400 which will include air travel to and accommodation in Hong Kong; travel to, from and within China as well as meals and accommodation.

Itinerary: Sydney – Hong Kong – Kwangchow (Canton) – Kuilin – Chongqin – Wuhan – Beijing – Harbin (Manchuria) – Changhai – Kwang Chow – Sydney.

The size of the delegation will be 25 and to be eligible you are required to be a member of the LAA.
