SPECIAL LIBRARIES SECTION VIC GROUP

Freelancers and Consultants in the Library World: A view from Victoria' was the theme of the July 22 meeting of the Special Libraries Section, Victorian Group. Believed to be the first formal gathering concerned with freelancers and consultants in Australia, the audience included students and librarians from a much broader cross-section than special libraries alone. The attractive venue and catering were provided courtesy of Hoechst Australia Pty Ltd.

After defining the scope of the program and setting it within a more international context, the convenor, Sue Hill, introduced freelancers and consultants known in the Melbourne area. Resisting the temptation to advertise/promote their own businesses, the panelists - Muriel Mathers (Freelance Library Services), Jan Porter (Triad Library Consultants/Triad Information Management) and Helen Campbell (Information Services) - discussed the background and nature of their work.

After addressing the how and why these 'alternative librarians' participate within the library world and information industry, specific attention was given to how this rapidly expanding sector within librarianship could be acknowledged and best utilized by the LAA.
