of the Science Division in the ANU Library.*

The successful candidate will be responsible
for advising the Librarian on all matters relating
to the Science collection and services as re-
quired. These collections are located in the
Library, J.G. Crawford building and six specialist
libraries, totalling some 233,000 volumes.

The libraries of the Science Division serve the
Research Schools of the ANU and the Science
Departments of The Faculties. Particular empha-

FOUNDATION MEMBER DIES

MR L. C. KEY, a foundation member of
