

Australian Libraries participate in EBSCONET

La Trobe University Library and CSIRO Central Library have agreed to become test users of EBSCO's Online Subscription Service – EBSCONET.

EBSCONET operates through a computer terminal in the user library, linked to the tost computer in Birmingham, Alabama and caters for direct communication of subscription information. Two EBSCONET systems for serials management are available: the Online Subscription Service (OSS) and the Serials Control System (SCS). Both La Irobe and CSIRO are evaluating the usefultess of OSS which allows: transmitting claims; transmitting interim subscription orders; accessing EBSCO's title file and Missng Copy Bank; and accessing the Summary of Publications Ordered for reviewing all orders.

While further information on EBSCO-NET is available from EBSCO Subscription Services, any other Australian libraries making use of this service are invited to share their findings with La Trobe and CSIRO. Directory of online search services in Australia

The number and variety of online information services in Australia has increased enormously since the introduction of MIDAS in 1979. The activity reported by the National Libary's *Network Study No. 4* in 1977 has blossomed remarkably quickly.

In an attempt to fill a gap in the range of directories of Australian information services, Alex Byrne is compiling the first national *Directory of Online Search Services* to be published by the Footscray Institute of Technology Library. Its publication will allow us to easily find answers to such frequently asked questions as:

• Who is using BRS and can describe their experiences?

- Is there a publicly available online search service in Camooweal?
- Does the Julatten School of Arts have an online search service?

Map curator resigns

After four years as Map Curator at the National Library of Australia, Mrs Dorothy Prescott has resigned to open her own consultancy in map information and research and map library management.

Mrs Prescott, who was responsible for discovering that the National Library held the world's only known copy of the Doncker Sea Atlas of 1659 and who supervised the automated cataloguing of the Library's map collection, was previously Curator of Maps at the University of Melbourne.

She has also been involved in the work of the Anglo-American Cataloguing Committee for Cartographic Materials in setting international rules and standards for cataloguing such material and will continue to represent the Australian Map Circle on this committee.

After a fishing holiday in Darwin, Mrs Prescott will be based in Canberra till November, when she will move to Melbourne.

Senior library appointment

Mrs Frances Awcock has been appointed Director, Technical Services of the Library Council of Victoria. This position is one of six new senior management positions created after a review of the Library Council's operations last year.

Mrs Awcock was previously a Systems Consultant with Libramatic Systems Pty Ltd. Her experience includes working as Librarian-in-Charge at the Australian Science Education Project, as Acquisitions Librarian at Toorak Teachers' College, and eight years as Technical Services Librarian at the State College of Victoria, Toorak. While at the State College, Mrs Awcock was a member of the College Council as the academic staff representative. The College also sent her on a two month staff development leave programme to the University of Oregon to research the impact of library automation on library services.
