he 9th Biennale of Illustrators Bratislava 3IB) will take place from September 1-)ctober 30, 1983. This international xhibition of illustrations for children's ooks has been held for 20 years and has beome an important way of bringing together ne creative arts of people from all parts of ne worldl.

The exhibition will be held at the House f Culture in Bratislava and will include aditional displays, including exhibitions by oald Als of Denmark, the holder of the BIB rand Prix, and Zbygnien Rychlicki of Poand, the present holder of the Hans Chrisan Andærsen plaque. On September 12 and 3 there will be a symposium on the Historial Development of Art as a Source of Inspiation in the Evolution of Children's Book lustrations.

This week the Institution of Engineers Australia takes a major step forward in improving access to engineering information. ENGINE, a new database covering all aspects of engineering in Australia, has been added to ACI's AUSINET national information service.

ENGINE indexes the publications of the Institution and includes annual reports, conference papers, journal articles, books and previously unpublished material.

If you need to know whether drawbar pull is a factor in tractor failure, or whether the sediment carried by the Burdekin River reaches the Barrier Reef, or are merely curious about the influence of Lawrence Hargrave's box kite on European aviation, ENGINE can provide the answers.

For people keen to know about such diverse subjects as Australia's engineering heritage, per capita car ownership, the price of oil in real terms between 1972 and 1983, or even the types of lighthouse illumination, ENGINE will shed its own light.

ENGINE joins 20 other Australian databases covering topics from AAP to zincalume. Access is open to anyone from anywhere in Australia. A terminal and an AUSINET sign-on, both available from ACI, are the only requirements. To search the new database costs \$65 per connect hour.


