EMERITUS PROFESSOR J.A. La Nauze has made a gift of a significant collection of over 500 books to the University Library.

Professor La Nauze is not only a distinguished historian, but has a real interest in and love of books. This collection includes copies of the first editions of Adam Smith's *Wealth of Nations* (1776) and David Ricardo's *On the Principles of Political Economy and Taxation* (1817). Other important items are first editions of T.R. Malthus' *Principles of Political Economy* (1820), J. Harris, *Essay on Money and Coins* (1757-8), J.M. Keynes' *Treatise on Money* (1930) and *The General Theory of Employment Interest and Money* (1936). Several of these volumes are association copies and many have fine leather bindings.

The University Librarian, Mr Colin Steele, said the holdings of the Australian National University Library were much enhanced by Professor La Nauze's magnificent donation which would provide a rich source for scholars and bibliophiles.
