It is awarded for personal research and/or innovation likely to lead to improvements in service over a wide area.

WAIT develops KWOCA

The Western Australian Institute of Technology Library has recently developed an online keywork access facility to its main catalogue file, containing approximately 200,000 records. KWOCA (Key Word Online Catalogue Access) has been in use by library staff for several months and is now available to WAIT teaching departments or any other interested institutions by dial-up or leased-line access.

KWOCA was developed by the Library Systems Officer to provide additional ways of finding relevant material in the library, apart from the controlled author, title, series and subject headings used in WAIT's microfiche catalogues.

Keyword access has several advantages for library users:

- Information obtained from the online file is the most accurate and up-to-date available. The online file also contains details of items currently being catalogued.
- Location of an item is possible even if exact details of the author or the filing element of the title are not known.
- Information on new or specific subjects can often be found more easily by searching on title keywords rather than by attempting to find appropriate subject headings.
- KWOCA's print function facilitates the compilation of bibliographies from the Library catalogues.

KWOCA runs on WAIT's DEC-10B computer. The system is menu-driven, has keyword browse and Boolean logic capabilities, and is very easy to use. For further information, contact the Principal Librarian, Mr G Allen.
