ONLINE SEARCHING **USING A** MICROCOMPUTER

The following information is given for those who may be trying to solve related problems.

Equipment

- IBM Personal Computer (twin disk drive)
- Modem or Acoustic Coupler
- Printer EPSON RX F/T
- DOS 2.10 (Disk Operating System)
- XTALK XVI, Communication Software which allows the microcomputer to interface with remote systems

Features

- Login procedures can be stored with the Function keys, eg, passwords, etc. Note: The first character of Austpac NUI numbers has to be input manually and the rest can be stored in a function key.
- Printing is also operated (on/off) from a function key.
- Downloading can be achieved with the CA (Capture) XTALK Command and creating a new file in the second disk drive. Downloading can be suspended by using a function key.
- Uploading: Either the login procedure or the search strategy or both can be uploaded line by line by doing the following:
- a. Using an editor (eg, Edlin) create a file with the required strategy.
- b. Load Communication Software (XTALK XVI) and proceed as usual to access the database required.

SPECIAL INTEREST GROUP: PUBLIC LIBRARY SERVICES FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES: WESTERN AUSTRALIA

Nine librarians attended the inaugural meeting of this group on Friday, 13 July 1984.

The group stemmed from a Conference on Library Services for the Handicapped held in March 1984 convened by The Library Board of Western Australia.

Feedback stressed the need for public librarians to meet regularly to share practical ideas and engage in continuing education programmes.

The group aims to complement the role of the Advisory Council on Library Services for the Handicapped (ACLSH) and Trish Flowers will act as a liaison person between groups.

- These 11 issues were listed as needing attention and more have been raised since:
- identification of disabled people within local communities.
- promotion of public library services to institutional-based disabled people and to those without these ties.
- identification of materials suitable for both disabled children and adults.
- organisation of staff to co-ordinate activities.
- contact people in libraries.
- adult literacy.
- the reading process.
- communication with disabled people. the line between social work and librar-
- ianship: The Role of Referral.
- organisations within Perth and local communities.
- . continuing education.

The Selection of Resources for Deaf Children was the topic for discussion at the second meeting of 20 public librarians. Margaret Warden, the Principal of the Deaf School in Mosman Park, Perth, addressed the group.
