The Committee recognises the enormity of the task to be carried out in 1985 and will be involving as many members as possible to ensure that the results are comprehensive. LAA STUDY GRANT AWARD WINNERS

The Association has awarded two Study Grants for 1985. Winners are Vicki Williamson, Reader Services Librarian at Armidale CAE and Trevor Zweck, Librarian of the Luther Seminary, Adelaide.

Vicki Williamson has been awarded \$3370 for a study of the library/learning resources support available to nursing programs at selected North American universities, and a review of the systems by which this support is delivered. She will be visiting universities in San Diego, Austin, Boston and Chicago in February and March 1985.

Trevor Zweck has been awarded \$2000 to study trends and developments in theological librarianship, with special attention to networking, standards and co-operation in the applications of computer technology, especially OPACS. He hopes to undertake his study between May and July, and an extensive itinerary is planned in the US.


