This new regional group was formed last November and for 1985 is concentrating on publicity and promotion of libraries and librarians in the area.

Our major effort to date has been the entry of a float in the Bendigo Easter Procession. The theme was (inevitably!) Victoria's 150th Anniversary. We had a tray truck with a tableau of a nineteenth century library (complete with picture of Queen Victoria and 'no spitting' sign) – Libraries Old – followed by a bookmobile plastered with posters featuring Libraries New. Children dressed as fictional characters walked alongside wearing sandwich boards showing library services and the names of local libraries. The photo (above) hardly shows its full glory - we thought it was terrific - but the memory of all the work that went into it will have to fade before we can contemplate doing it again next year!

That was March. The editor of the local paper (the *Bendigo Advertiser*) gave a talk in February on promotion of libraries in the area. He offered space, and the first of a series of monthly articles on the Group and its activities appeared in the Easter Saturday edition. We were delighted — we'd rather expected to be relegated to a low-circulation Monday.

In April we supported a SLAV function: Moira Robinson talking on recent trends in children's and young adults' fiction. This was very well attended, and a really absorbing presentation. In April we also made a verbal submission to the LAA Corporate Plan and Review Committee, concentrating on the advantages and disadvantages of 'country' membership.

Functions are advertised in *InCite*'s 'Happenings' columns, but we are also producing an irregular newsletter. The committee consists of Jennifer Goddard (president), Megan Evans (secretary), Edith Perry (treasurer), and Jan Barnett, John Butera, Merle Hall and Bev Porteous, representing respectively school, academic, special and public libraries in the areas.

Two general meetings have been held so far this year. In March at the Education Department Conference Room, Louise Lansley, Industrial Information and Research Officer of the Library Association of Australia, spoke on her role in the LAA, which helped clarify the misunderstandings about what this position encompasses. In April at BHP Petroleum Pty Ltd, Leigh Baker, Manager of Information Retrieval Services at ACI, persented a summary of his recent trip to Japan, Britain and the USA, looking at the overseas database scene and opportunities to export AUSINET, and a rundown of new developments in AUSI-NET planned for 1985. Full reports of these meetings have been published in the Group's Newsletter, v.2, no.2, May 1985.

A survey of Victorian Special Libraries was undertaken in March to form a picture of inter-lending and copying patterns to assist the Group in preparing any response to the Working Party on Document Delivery. Returns of this survey have been good and replies are currently being analysed.
