Lending Services Librarian

(Senior Librarian Grade 2)

Duties: Responsible to the Associate Librarian (Reader Services) for the administration of the Lending Services Department (52 staff) which incorporates the circulation and inter-library loan services in Fisher Library, and the maintenance of the shelving of several major collections.

A computerised loan system is currently in operation; the successful applicant will be required to contribute to the implementation of the circulation module of a new integrated library system planned for 1986.

Total loans from the Fisher Library are currently 476,000 per annum; in-coming and out-going inter-library loan requests number 22,000 annually and the major collections in the Fisher Library building total one million volumes, approximately.

Substantial supervisory experience in a large library is an essential requirement of the position.

Qualifications: A degree of a recognised University, CAE, or equivalent qualification, and eligibility for professional membership of the Library Association of Australia.

Salary: Within the range for Senior Librarian Grade 2, \$31,551-\$33,909 per annum.
