COMMONWEALTH ASSISTANCE FOR PUBLIC LIBRARIES CAMPAIGN

A meeting of State Campaign Co-ordinators was held in Sydney on August 7.

The meeting discussed a number of general ssues such as the focus of the campaign and then went on to examine the draft submission which is to be sent to the Government.

Co-ordinators were provided with lobbying cits containing material which will be useful for the campaign in each state. In addition, the possibility of seeking advice from a professional lobbyist is to be investigated.

A submission outlining the case of Commonwealth Government assistance for multicultural library services in public libraries is to be sent to Federal Members of Parliament at the end of August. A separate submission presenting a case for improved library services for Aborigines will follow.

A letter is to be sent from the National Coordinating Committee for the Campaign to all local government bodies, regional librarians and Local Government Associations informing them about the campaign and enclosing a list of State Co-ordinators and a summary of the campaign submission.
