Victoria College

Victoria College, the second largest college of advanced education in Victoria, advises that they have selected the Adlib computerised library system which is capable of serving its own four campuses and other educational institutions as well.

Launching the \$½ million system in October at the newly built library on the Burwood Campus of Victoria College, Dr Graeme Allen, chairman of the Victorian Post-Secondary Education Commission, said he hoped the College would explore the possibility of sharing the system with others.

Dr Géza Kósa, Associate College Librarian, responsible for managing the Adlib system, said the usual problems of bibliographic control were compounded since Victoria College's book collection and library service is dispersed over four campuses across the eastern suburbs of Melbourne, at Burwood, Prah-

ran, Rusden (Clayton) and Toorak, resulting from the amalgamation of the four previously autonomous colleges in 1981. A computerised on-line library system provided the obvious means by which the bibliographic information needs of the College could be satisfied.

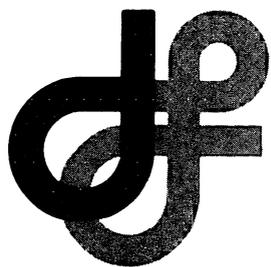
The Adlib turnkey on-line library system has been marketed in Australia since 1984 by Primary Software P/L in Melbourne. The hardware includes a Prime 2550 computer, with 900 Mb disk storage and 42 terminals.

The software package covers all phases of library operation including acquisitions, cataloguing, on-line public access catalogue, circulation and serials modules.

The cataloguing and circulation control modules on the Burwood and Rusden campuses are already in operation, with Toorak and Prahran soon to follow. On-line public access catalogues will be the next stage of implementation, and this service will provide instant access to Victoria's College's substantial holdings.

The conversion of bibliographic records into machine readable form was done by SAZTEC Australia P/L in Sydney.
