n November 29 the Community Services Librian of the State Library of NSW, Val Moon, ok part in a seminar on Library Services to eople with Disabilities, organised by the Rivina Community Library.

The seminar was based on the contents of e Staff Training Package on Library Serces to People with Disabilities produced by e State Library of NSW in conjunction with embers of the NSW Working Party on Libry Services to People with Disabilities. The ackage has been developed to assist libraries nd other agencies) to plan and run seminars, orkshops and staff awareness/training sesons in order to raise the level of awareness staff regarding these specialised needs.

A copy of the Package has been made availole to all NSW Public Libraries, and it is nticipated that the Community Services Librian will assist in planning and running proammes based on the Staff Training Package many regions of the state.

The seminar was attended by people from mmunity groups, staff of the Riverina Mury Institute of Higher Education, as well as aff from the Wagga Wagga City Library and estern Riverina Community Library. Its sucss was influenced very much by the audiice and their contributions. Several of the irticipants represented particular disability oups and their willingnesss to share their ersonal experiences of their disability was garded as the most valuable aspect of the scussions.

A demonstration of the Community Inforation for the Disabled Service was much apeciated by the participants. The Community formation for the Disabled Service (CID) has en developed by a group of people includg the Riverina Community Library Service. ne computer and operator are presently ised in the Tumut Neighbourhood Centre id information is generally available by lephone.

The seminar was judged to have been most ccessful. Staff of the libraries have reiested further programmes to provide eater awareness of specific areas with imications for their library services. A series of orter training/awareness sessions will start ortly.

The presentation of such seminars and aining programmes is seen as valuable not ly in developing and improving library ser-

vices to people with disabilities but as part of a continuing process of awareness raising. Librarians planning programmes are encouraged to include discussions relating to needs in such areas as access, education, employment, independence, and leisure and information.
