# AUSTRALIAN LIBRARIES AND INFORMATION COUNCIL (ALIC) Study of School Use of Networks and Information Retrieval Systems

ALIC was established in 1982, to advise relevant Ministers on means of securing cooperation and coordination between the Commonwealth and the States in the development of library and related information services.

ALIC wishes to commission a study to determine the extent of the use in schools of networks and information retrieval systems to supplement the information that is available to them from their own library services. The study is to examine the perceived advantages and limitations of these systems and networks with a view to identifying ways of further improving access to information services. \$10,000 is available to meet costs including travel.
