Booksellers' Mecca

The Riyah Exhibition Centre, Saudi Arabia, will be alive early next year with the inaugural international Saudi Bookfair. This will be held 11–15 January 1987, giving publishers world-wide an opportunity to display their wares in the largest book import market in the Middle East.

The fair takes place at an important time in the Kingdom's development as the education system gears up for an estimated 38% increase in student enrolment in higher education, technical and vocational training. Imports of books in English are currently valued at US \$18 million per annum. Imports of library systems, furniture and shelving, computer data storage, microfilm, microfiche and library security systems look to be another promising market.

Saudi BookFair is run in conjunction with the established SaudiEducation, Saudi-Computer and SaudiBusiness shows. CALL FOR NOMINATIONS

At a meeting held on 27 and 28 June 1986 the General Council of the Library Association of Australia resolved to change the composition of the General Council. It is now to consist of the President, Vice-President (President-elect), Past President, the Chairman of the Board of Education, and one member appointed by each Branch. The positions of General Treasurer, General Secretary and General Councillor-at-large are to be abolished at the end of the terms of the present incumbents.

In accordance with Division F Regulations nominations are now called for the position of Vice-President 1987 (President-elect 1988). Nominees must be financial members of the Association. Candidates and nominators should read the relevant regulations carefully.

Please note that nominations shall be:

- in writing;
- signed by two financial members of the LAA:
- accompanied by the written consent of the nominee, who shall supply a curriculum vitae and a statement of professional concerns (each of no more than 100 words).

Nominations must reach the Executive Director, LAA, 376 Jones Street, Ultimo NSW 2007 by 5 pm on 1 September 1986.
