

## ACT Library Service

The Canberra Public Library Service will now be known as the ACT Library Service. The name has been changed to reflect the Library Service's progress to providing a State type library service to the ACT community. To enable a full range of library services to be available a proposal for a new Central Library building in Civic Centre is currently being developed. The position of City Librarian will be redesignated Director, ACT Library Service.

★ Joyce Kirk has recently taken up an appointment as Lecturer, Department of Information Studies, Kuring-gai College. Previously a Senior Education Officer, Library Services, NSW Department of Education, she was involved in the development of an Information Skills K-12 Curriculum. ## Big Print

In the past visually impaired people have had limited access to quality Australian fiction and have had to rely almost entirely on a handful of Australian novels imported from overseas.

Australian Large Print was established in 1985 as a result of requests from librarians for more large print books with Australian content. It aims to produce large print editions of quality Australian fiction utilising all Australian materials, expertise and printing. The first two titles in their publishing program, Evan Green's *Alice to Nowhere* and Lyne Mitchell's *Man From Snowy River*, were released earlier this year.



## Accessioning accessory

The State Library of Queensland bindery has come up with a very practical solution to an accessioning problem; where to put the item while you are using the keyboard?

The stand has been designed to be used with a split level workstation, where the keyboard can be set below the level of the screen. The stand sits between the screen and keyboard with its rear edge under the screen supports. This positions the item in the operator's line of sight and provides a counterbalance for heavy volumes.

The overall width is 48 cm. with a cross-section as illustrated. The stands are constructed from 3 000cm strawboard reinforced along the lower edge and covered in mottled neutral grey Crash Canvas.



## Treasures Revealed


Of all the wrecks scattered around the South Australian coastline, one of the most significant is that of the barque *Zanoni*. It has remained untouched, unlooted for 116 years, lying on the seabed near Ardrossan in the Gulf of St. Vincent.

The *Zanoni*, typical of the many small sailing vessels which brought the first colonists to South Australia, is noteworthy due to her composite construction. She had an iron frame-work covered with a teak hull, similar to the famous *Cutty Sark* preserved in Britain.

Many of the treasures recovered from the *Zanoni* will be on display for the first time in the Exhibition Hall at the State Library of South Australia.
