Since the publication of the draft program, three exciting new speakers have agreed to address Australia's Second Online Information Conference in Sydney, 26-29 January 1987

Joseph W. Price is responsible for directing the efforts of the Library of Congress in exploring the use of new optical disc technologies. LC has undertaken a number of projects to transfer various parts of its collection (eg photographs, films, music) to laserdiscs (eg videodiscs, CD-ROMs) and to provide online access to them. As well as reporting on these projects, Joseph Price will speak on government involvement in the provision of online information. During his stay in Australia, Mr Price, who is Chief of LC's Science & Technology Division, will also be advising

A European flavour has been added to the Conference with the inclusion of Brendan Walsh in the line-up of speakers. Brendan is Under-Secretary for the Information Technology Group of the Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales. His paper entitled 'Business and databases: who is using them and why; the British and European experience', will be included in the Business Applications session. Brendan has just completed a business users' guide to online information; this is destined to become an industry standard in the UK, and Canadian and Australian versions of the book are in the pipeline. Brendan has also written several articles for accounting journals on the electronic way of keeping in touch. His paper will be of interest to both business users and information professionals.

Artificial intelligence and expert systems have the potential to revolutionise the future of the information service profession. Professor Brian Garner of Deakin University is one of the leading exponents of the uses of AI, and is investigating user interface applica-tions. His paper, 'Discourse understanding for untutored users', has significant implications for online information intermediaries.
