

Music report available

'ollowing a consultancy undertaken last year by Proifessor Warren Bebbington, Dean of fusic at the University of Queensland, the A. College of Advanced Education Library has recently received a comprehensive 104 hage report with recommendations for the derelopment of its services and resources to upport music courses in the College.

Professor Bebbington, who is one of Ausralia's foremost musicologists, notes in his eport: 'The following study has few precelents albroad and none at all in Australia; unloubtedly, some of its findings will be of conside:rable interest to those responsible for nusic collections beyond the College . . '

Three new appointments have been announced by the State Library of NSW:

Janine Schmidt, formerly Senior Lecturer, Department of Information Studies, Kuring-gai College of Advanced Education, has been appointed Director, Collection Services.

As a member of Senior Management Janine will be responsible for the implementation and co-ordination of the development and management of objectives, policies and strategies for acquisitions, including collection development, cataloguing, storage, restoration and conservation of the collections. With the challenge of preserving the nation's past for the future the State Library is confronting the major conservation problems facing large research collections.

The impact of new technologies on collection development, and the improvement of intellectual access to information records are Janine's major areas of interest. Libraries she has worked in include the University of Queensland Library, CSIRO Central Library and the University of New South Wales where she was foundation Physical Sciences Librarian. She spent 1984 on secondment to Insearch Ltd, Australian agent for DIALOG. Rosemary Moon has been appointed Senior Librarian, State Film Library, State Library of NSW. She will manage the day to day operations of the Film Library, including promoting the Library and organising events such as film festivals and public screenings.



Rosemary has worked in film production in London and Sydney where she was involved in making educational documentaries for an international market. In 1979, she received a post-graduate diploma in communications at the NSW Institute of Technology specialising in film and television. She was secretary of the Australian Society for Educational Technology (NSW Chapter) from 1977-1985, and has spoken about and published articles on children and television for the Children's Book Council of Australia. From 1981-1985 she provided audiovisual consultancy services as part of her role as Children's Libraries Consultant at the Public Libraries Dept. State Library of NSW.
