# CIN — sharing the joodies

or a number of years people working in thools have recognised that one of the officious of school-based curriculum development has been a plethora of curriculum marials such as school-based programs, units work, program outlines, and teacher development material as well as syllabus and policy atements produced by departments of eduction. Much of this material is of interest to a audience wider than originally intended, it previously no mechanism existed for the trieval of, or access to, this information.

In an attempt to enable the sharing of curculum developments between schools, states id systems the Schools Commission and ate/territory departments of education have idertaken the establishment of a curriculum tabase, the Australian Curriculum Inforation Network (ACIN). It is available rough ASCIS (the Australian Schools Catague Information Network). Each state colts and enters records for their own publicaons and documents. The records include bibgraphic data and an abstract describing its rpose, content, and applicability to the curulum. The initial areas for collecting marials include education; Australian studies; mputer education; education of girls; nuracy and literacy and peace education. Inmation about materials in other curricun areas is gradually being added.

Overall development of ACIN is facilitated by a management committee which includes the national co-ordinator and representatives from the Schools Commission, state/territory directors of curriculum and Catholic and Independent school systems. The states and territories each have their own co-ordinator who meet periodically to make recommendations on selection of material, data entry and other technical matters.

The database is being made available to schools in a variety of ways. Schools can access the database either online through ASCIS or through a microfiche subscription service. In New South Wales ACIN is being combined with NCIN, the NSW Curriculum Information Network, in order to provide NSW schools with access to documents of more local interest. A similar approach is being taken in South Australia.

Access to the documents referred to in the database was a major consideration in establishing the ACIN. All abstracts include information about availability. Several states are making many of their curriculum documents available on microfiche so that requests can be met quickly and inexpensively.
