

Reaching for the stars

The International Astronomical Union has requested that an astronomy thesaurus be compiled for the use of authors, editors and librarians working in the field of astronomy and astrophysics.

The project involving the cooperation and expertise of eight librarians around the world is being coordinated by Robyn Shobbrook, librarian of the Anglo-Australian Observatory. The Observatory is a bi-national statutory authority engaged in astronomical research.

Robyn has organised the project on an international level so that the work load and cost of producing the thesaurus is shared amongst eight volunteer librarians from the UK, India, Canada, USA and Australia. 'Each librarian is working on a section of the alphabet by compiling a base list of preferred terms from authoritative sources according to an internationally accepted standard', says Robyn, 'the base list will then be compiled at the AAO using the MICROCAIRS software and the first draft will be ready by August'.

The thesaurus will help authors and editors of scientific manuscripts. In particular it will also aid the selection of keyboards for more effective retrieval of documents in manual and automated systems in the field of astronomy.

CALL FOR NOMINATIONS

At a meeting held on 27 and 28 June 1986 the General Council of the Library Association of Australia resolved to change the composition of the General Council. It is now to consist of the President, Vice-President (President-elect), Past President, the Chairperson of the Board of Education, and one member appointed by each Branch. The positions of General Treasurer, General Secretary and General Councillor-atlarge were abolished at the end of the terms of the present incumbents and therefore nominations for these positions will not be called.

In accordance with Division F Regulations nominations are now called for the position of Vice-President 1988 (President-elect 1989). Nominees must be financial members of the Association. Candidates and nominators should read the relevant regulations carefully.
