Directory for disabled

The National Library of Australia is preparing to publish a third edition of Library and Information Services for People with Disabilities: a directory. The library will soon be distributing a questionnaire to gather up-to-date information about organisations which provide library or information services for people with disabilities.

The second edition, *Directory of Library Services for the Handicapped in Australia*, was published in 1983 and is now considerably out of date.

Open all hours

Around Australia the deregulation of retail shopping hours is responding to modern community needs, but how well are public lending libraries responding? Not too well as a recent LAA survey suggests. Only 34 (7.24%) of library services provide Saturday afternoon opening, only 6 (1.27%) provide Sunday AM opening and only 34 (7.74%) provide Sunday PM opening.

These libraries have found weekend opening highly successful. The General Council is concerned about the opportunity cost of restricted public library hours in the context of the National Information Policy promotion.
