Local Government labour markets

The National Review of Local Government abour Markets has released its third discusion paper on Reciprocity of Qualifications Across States.

The paper examines the existing system elated to statutory positions in Local Government around Australia with a view to improving flexibility in Local Government employment. It looks at the functions of existing degistration Boards, the role of professional codies and the reciprocal agreements concerning qualifications for statutory positions.

The paper suggests three options:

- maintaining the existing Registration/Qualification Boards
- developing a national accreditation system abolition of the prescribed requirements for statutory positions

The consultancy team for the Commonwealth schools Commission funded Learning and the nformation Needs of Schools Project has comnenced work. The team consists of:

- Dr Barbara Poston-Anderson, Head of the Department of Information Studies, Kuring-gai CAE, whose special expertise lies in literature research and review, the professional development of teachers and teacherlibrarians, and the analysis of library functions.
- Joyce Kirk, lecturer in the Department of Information Studies, KCAE, whose main fields of expertise include developing information skills, programs and strategies appropriate for implementing change in schools.

Hilary Yerbury who is a lecturer in the Department of Information Studies, KCAE, and has considerable research and consultancy experience and skills in the analysis of information needs and the development of appropriate services.

The consultants have begun the task of athering information, investigating school braries, resource centres, information handling and management, and reviewing facility tandards. Throughout the project the emphasis will be placed on learning/teaching and curiculum aspects of the project rather than pace requirements and functional standards, Ithough these aspects will also be researched and recommendations made.

The final product is expected to be an attractive and easily readable document which will ssist in planning for meeting individual chool's needs in the area of learning and infornation needs. The report is expected to be ompleted and ready for publication by the nd of September 1988.
