Applications rolling into RMIHE

Once again the School of Information Studies at Riverina-Murray Institute of Higher Education has attracted a large number of applications from students seeking to enrol in its library science courses.

The School continues to offer all its courses in the external mode in order to serve the needs of employed librarians and isolated students Australia wide. The bad news is, like all other institutions, because of quota restrictions imposed by funding, RMIHE is not able to accept all applicants. The good news is that because of strong demand the 1987 intake was increased by 38 percent and this could occur again in 1988.

The School expects the high demand for its courses to continue into the future.

Disability thesaurus

At the Second National Conference on Information Systems for People with Disabilities in 1986, the desire for a uniform vocabulary for indexing disability information was expressed. A Bicentennial grant to ACROD and DPI (Disabled Peoples' International) resulted, and development of an Australian disability thesaurus has begun.

The project officer, Lorraine Slee, has consulted with interested groups on broad design considerations. These include the existence of several relevant overseas thesauri, and the commitment of many disability organisations to broader library or community networks within each state.

Although the problems arising from diverse applications of the thesaurus are still to be resolved, it is hoped that the work will be completed by June 1988. Further details can be obtained from Lorraine Slee at ACROD, PO Box 60, Curtin ACT 2605.
