Libex expands

LISU — FMWU Merger

The amended membership rule of the Federal Miscellaneous Workers Únion (NSW Branch) was registered by the Industrial Registrar on December 1986, thus clearing the way for implementation of the remaining procedures to effect the merger between the Library and Information Staff Union and the FMWU.

The FMWU will now be able to proceed with the LISU award application.

DEIR dispute

A dispute regarding the removal of the Industrial Relations Library from the Department of Employment and Industrial Relations in Farrell Place, Canberra has been satisfactorily resolved.

ACOA had placed a picket line outside the library to prevent its relocation and POA members in the library banned the packing of boxes.

The negotiated agreement provides for the retention of a small library collection in the Farrell Place library and the establishment of a joint working party to oversee the forward planning of a new library building.

New Classification

Agreement has been reached between the parties for the introduction of a new classification for Library Technicians working in South Australian municipal libraries.

The new classification will provide for two grades of library technician. Proposed salary ranges are \$19366 - \$21465 per annum for Library Technician Grade 1 and \$22505 -\$24569 per annum for Library Technician Grade 2.

It is expected that an order will shortly be issued in terms of the agreed draft.

The Municipal Officers Association is continuing a series of extensive inspections in support of its claim for Chief Librarians in South Australia.

Wollongong City Library is one of five regional libraries participating in this scheme which is being jointly undertaken by the Australian Government Publishing Service and the Library Association of Australia.

Users of participating libraries will be able

- purchase selected AGPS publications at their library
- obtain information about the range of publications produced by the Australian Government
- order AGPS publications not stocked by the library directly from AGPS

Other participating libraries are:

- Geelong Regional Library
- North Central Goldfields Library, Bendigo
- Regional Library, Murray Upper
- State Reference Library, Darwin

The Pilot project was first suggested to AGPS by the Library Association of Australia as a means of both improving the range of services offered to the community by public libraries and expanding the role of libraries as information and resource centres.


