Best of British books

Perth City Library recently hosted the British Council's exhibition of books which have won British literary prizes since 1984. The exhibition is the Council's contribution to Australia's Bicentenary and will be on show at various venues around the country.

The prize-winning books cover almost every category of writing: science fiction, religion, travel, detective fiction, history, romantic fiction, books on folklore and the performing arts. The Lord Mayor, Mr M. A. Michael and the British Consul General, Mr Leonard Boyes, launched the exhibition. The exhibition gave the people of Perth an opportunity to browse through a representative collection of the best of British books.

Children are the future

The 1988 theme for Children's Week is 'Children are the future — looking at the next 200 years'. A series of awards are made during Children's Week, held this year on 22-30 October, including Parenthood Awards, Young Person's Award, Childcare Worker's Award and a Family and/or Children's Award. Libraries for lighthouses

The lighthouse keepers of Neptune and Althorpe Islands can look forward to a little relief these days thanks to Minlaton Community School Library. The Library has extended its services so that, once a fortnight, a box from the Library is airlifted to the islands. The box holds a treasure trove of material including books, music and tapes.

The scheme started in November 1986, with a phone call from Althorpe Island asking if the library could supply them with books and tapes. Only too happy to oblige, the Minlaton Library took on the challenge. Since then another family from Neptune Island has come forward requesting the same service.
