Australian Libraries Summit



Margaret Trask will be chairing the Australian Libraries Summit to be held in Canberra in October 1988.

The Steering Committee at its meeting on the 3-4 August moved further towards defining the topics to be discussed and how they are to be approached at the final Summit. The sessions will be a mixture of plenary and concurrent sessions, dealing with such topics as national co-ordination; collection development; document delivery; the national database; user pays; school library resources; public libraries; users with special needs; access to government information; preservation; technology; education for librarianship. The complete agenda papers for the Summit will be made available to participants and State and Territory Groups by the end of August.

A final list of attending delegates will also be available at the end of the month. To date the delegates who have been invited are: State Territory Librarians, 8; University Librarians, 22; CSIRO, 1; Schools of library education, 7; CAE, 8, TAFE library services, 8; public libraries 17, special libraries 14; heads of school library services, 8; LAA School Libraries Section, 6; ASCIS, 1; parliamentary libraries, 3; information industry, 6; local government, 1; LAA, 4; Australian Council of Archives, 1; literature and cultural bodies' 5; personal invi-

tations' 6; authors of issue papers, 9; Steering Committee members, 8; state and territory committee representatives, 7.

Irish gift to NLA

Mr Charles Haughey, the Irish Prime Minister, presented Ireland's Bicentennial gift, convicts transportation records, to Mr Bob Hawke, the Australian Prime Minister. The presentation, on 12 July, took place at the National Library of Australia where the archives enabling Australians of Irish descent to trace their ancestors, would be kept.

The records, some 105 rolls of microfilm, relate to 39,000 Irish men, women and children sent as convicts to Australia during the period 1788 to 1868. The gift includes a computerised index which provides easy access to information on individual prisoners. The index constitutes the centrepiece of the exhibition mounted to mark the arrival of the gift. The National Library's exhibition, 'The Harp and the Southern Cross' will be open to the public until September.

Mr Punch, Australian Minister for Arts, took the opportunity to present the two Prime Ministers with facsimile editions of three rare pamphlets on convict transportation. On the occasion, the minister said that copies of the Irish Bicentennial gift would be distributed to all state libraries.


