Worksafe Australia is the Federal Government agency responsible for occupational health and safety matters.

As part of its activities, Worksafe Australia has developed an extensive library collection encompassing:

- . 16,000 books and pamphlets;
- . 850 journal titles;
- . 200 videos and audio-visual kits; and
- . full-text microfiche of a number of major series of documents.

In order to provide people working in the occupational health and safety field with details of sources of published information and to make its own collection more accessible, Worksafe Australia is producing a microfiche version of its Library's Author/Title and Subject catalogues. The microfiche catalogue lists all material held by the Library except journal titles.

Subscription to the microfiche catalogue, which will be updated quarterly, is \$50 for the first year. The first issue will be available in November 1988. Included in this price is a binder and microfiche holder which will be sent with the first issue. It is anticipated that the subscription for the second year will be \$25.
